Terms you may hear in this presentation **GLBTQIA**

- Gay / Lesbian "Homosexual" : Someone who is attracted to the same gender that they identify as.
- **Bisexual** : Someone who is attracted to 2 genders.
- Transgender : An Umbrella term that refers to a wide range of Gender non conforming or Gender Variant individuals.
- Queer: Is a term that used to have a negative meaning that the community is taking back as a positive self descriptive umbrella term. Can refer to anyone outside the mainstream.
- Intersex : Is a variation in sex characteristics including chromosomes, gonads, or genitals that do not allow an individual to be distinctly identified as male or female.



- Ally : Typically any non-LGBT person who supports and stands up for the rights of LGBT people, though LGBT people can be allies, such as a lesbian who is an ally to a transgender or bi person.
- Asexual : Without sexual feelings or associations.
- Cisgender : A person who identifies as the gender they were assigned at birth.
- Heterosexual : A person who is attracted to the opposite gender.
- Much easier to say LGBTQ+ when referring to the community.

THE LGBTQ+ & FAITH PARADOX



- Usually in Suicide Prevention situations we like to use Faith Based Communities as protective factors.
- But when working with LGBTQ+ individuals Faith Based Communities can have the opposite effect.
- In-fact depending on the study the risk of a suicide attempt is four to six time greater if they have a strong faith Based background and that Background is not LGBT Affirming.

Missing voices project



- In this research project it was shown that there is a disproportionate reliance on anti LGBTQ+ religious voices commenting on LGBTQ+ people and issues in mainstream media.
- There is also an underrepresentation of religious voices from Tradition and faith communities that are supportive and embracing of the LGBTQ+ Community and Equality.




- In fact 2 out of 4 religious messages in media came from people whose religions have formal policies opposing LGBTQ+ Equality.
- Despite the fact that acceptance of LGBTQ+ people is growing across multiple Faith Traditions

ASSOCIATION OF RELIGIOSITY WITH SEXUAL MINORITY SUICIDE IDEATION & ATTEMPT





- "Religious groups who stigmatize LGBT people should be aware of the potential damage they can do to an individual and families, and honestly the damage they do to themselves as an organization," study co-author John R. Blosnich
- Amelia Markham is a queer Christian activist with <u>The</u> <u>Reformation Project</u>, which works for the inclusion of LGBTQ people in the Christian church. They think Blosnich's study demonstrates that for many queer people, non-affirming theology is at best problematic and at worst lethal — "no matter how kindly or compassionately" it is articulated.

2014 NY study of 388 sexual minorities adults

 Found that individuals who sought religious based treatment for mental health had Higher frequencies of attempted & completed suicides.

LGB Suicide Statistics





- The Suicide Prevention Resource Center estimates between 30 40% of LGB youth have attempted suicide.
- Suicide is the third leading cause of death among LGB youth 14 to 24.
- LGB youth are four times more likely than their heterosexual peers to attempt Suicide.



- There is not a lot of data on the transgender community.
- Only two studies include gender, gender identity and gender expression.
- The chart on the next slide represents the findings from one of the studies.

TRANSGENDER STATS



• 33.2% of transgender youth have attempted suicide
